The Stuart Historic Homes Tour is just over 5 weeks away and we are looking forward to welcoming all the tour attendees to our neighborhood on Saturday & Sunday, October 4 - 5, from 12:00 - 5:00 pm each day. The momentum and energy around this event continues to build with more ticket sales, more sponsorships, and more partnerships with local businesses across Kalamazoo. Here is a sneak peak into three more tour homes.



The Loveland-Curtenius House (1909)

The unique style of this home is Mission, achieving its greatest popularity in the southwestern United States. This home was completed in 1909 for William and Ada Loveland. William was a prominent Kalamazoo businessman who became the president and general manager of the Watervliet Paper Company. In 1922, the home was sold to Alfred and Aimee Curtenius and they lived in the home until 1931. Alfred was a six term city commissioner.



The Arthur-Pratt House (1890)

Built by Arthur Pratt in 1890. Pratt operated a large "Road Cart" Business, where he made wagons and Road Carts. He then expanded his business and formed a partnership in 1893, naming it "Specialty Manufacturing Co. Pratt lived in the home until the late 1890's, and then moved into his private residence on South Street, which is now occupied by "The Park Club". This brick Queen Anne features a rounded bay window, stained glass, a grand staircase with a prism-glass rounded window, and also had a "dumbwaiter" when originally built.



The Kalamazoo House Bed & Breakfast, David Lilienfeld House (1878)

Built by David Lilienfeld in 1878. This home has both Italianate and Queen Anne architectural features, including large decorative brackets, an Asymmetrical Facade, and decorative window headers and casings. It remains as one of the last homes in the 300 block of South Street. David, a wealthy German immigrant, with his brother William owned the D. Lilienfeld & Brothers Cigar Company. This home was scheduled to be demolished in 1985, but was saved through the efforts of Lou & Annette Conti. Today, it is called "The Kalamazoo House", and operates as a Bed and Breakfast.



Active since New Year's Day, 2012, **Creep Church** is a prolific composition project originally based in Providence, RI (now Kalamazoo, MI). Creep Church has been sharing their evocative, minimalist instrumentals throughout West Michigan beginning in 2018 and has opened for artists as diverse as Kee Avil and Speedy Ortiz. Described as cinematic by more than one listener, Creep Church utilizes solo guitar to create soundtracks for indie films that have yet to be produced.

Caitlin Brooks, born in Kalamazoo and raised in Richland, is largely self-taught in guitar and saxophone, supplementing her skills with sporadic private clarinet, saxophone, and guitar lessons. Originally trained classically, Brooks explored rock, blues, and jazz, culminating in the development of her unique neo-soul style, characterized by the fusion of rock's driving rhythms, blues' expressive phrasing, and jazz's rich harmonies. Brooks' warm, punchy alto voice enables her to create songs that appeal broadly.

Hopie Jo is a gender-fluid singer-songwriter and multi-instrumentalist with over a decade of experience performing music around the US Midwest and Pacific Northwest. Named appropriately for their fun and quirky stage presence, Hopie's music is expressive, whimsical, and playful with streaks of sadness and deep vulnerability. With nature-focused themes and emotive lyrics, Hopie invites themselves and us all on the journey toward self-acceptance and self-love. Her more recent work has been described by friends as meditative and spacious, allowing the listener to step into the present moment. You will find this guy crooning right into your heart!
