The Stuart Historic Neighborhood Association is ready to kick off the first phase of the KRVT Placemaking Project. The Stuart Association and the City of Kalamazoo will be hosting workshops for residents, businesses, and city and county staff on July 20, 22, and 23, respectively. The purpose of these workshops is to gather ideas for the design of the public space that will become the heart of the Stuart neighborhood.

The site for this project is at the northwest corner of Kalamazoo and Westnedge Ave. This is a prime location with the event center going up diagnonally from it, the conversion of Kalamazoo Ave. into a two-way residential street, and the Arcadia Creek project.

REASON #1 - TO CONNECT

The location of this public space and how it connects to the broader community is one reason why this project is important to the Stuart neighborhood.

The Stuart neighborhood, the Northside neighborhood, and the Central Business District all converge together at this location. The Kalamazoo River Valley Trail and the future Arcadia Creek path can be accessed to run, bike, or walk. The site also features the railroad tracks with Amtrak trains passing by daily.

Turning this public space into the Heart of Stuart will strengthen all of these connections.


The Stuart Yard Sign

The Stuart Neighborhood Annual Meeting

Happening on August 24 and Bylaws Changes Will Be Voted On

The Neighborhood Annual Meeting has been moved to Saturday, August 24, 3:00 - 5:00 pm, at Woodward School. One agenda item is to vote on changes to the bylaws recommended by the Stuart Association ByLaws Committee. The committee made the following recommendations.

- 5.01 The annual meeting of the Members of the Corporation shall be held ANNUALLY. It shall include a presentation of annual reports to the members, the election of new board members and Directors, and such other businesses may properly come before the meeting.
- 6.02 (DELETE THE FOLLOWING) Board may include a seat for one person that is not a member resident, property or business owner. Once elected this individual will have all the rights as a member of the Board with the exception that they may not serve on the Executive Board. This individual must be elected yearly, and can serve for a maximum of a 3-year term.
- 6.02 Board Members shall be elected to terms of one (1) year and may be reelected for multiple terms.

These Bylaws changes were voted on at the June 11, 2024 Board Meeting and the next step requires a simple majority vote of the members attending the annual meeting on Saturday, August 24, 2024.


WORKSHOP PURPOSE & GOALS

1800s Historical Map of the Kalamazoo & Westnedge Ave. Corner

This map shows that in the 1800s the site was used for the Kalamazoo – South Haven Railroad Roadhouse and Turn Table. The turn table was approximately 75 feet in diameter and included six stalls made of bricks, making this a very active area with trains coming and going in multiple directions.
